Denton County Winter Weather Advisory Update

Lake Dallas, TX, February 4, 2022

CURRENT SITUATION

Friday, February 4, 2022 – Oncor personnel and out of state utility partners made significant progress overnight rebuilding infrastructure and restoring power to customers affected by winter storm Landon.

While many new outages have occurred, mostly due to ice accumulation and other storm impacts, crews continue to respond as quickly and safely as possible. At this time, all power has been restored in Lake Dallas.

As ice begins to thaw, tree branches that have sagged downwards can also abruptly spring up, potentially impacting power lines and causing interruptions. This cycle may continue as temperatures rise and fall and lead to new or repeat outage events.

If you see a downed powerline, keep the following in mind:

- Leave the area and call 9-1-1. Also note that anything touching a power line, such as a tree branch, could also be electrified. Stay away and keep pets, children and others away from the area.
- Do not attempt to remove debris and tree limbs from areas near power lines. The debris may be concealing a live wire or downed power line.
- Avoid travel or use extreme caution when on the roadways.
- If you are experiencing an emergency event, call 911 immediately.
