Denton County Winter Weather Advisory Update

Lake Dallas, TX, February 4, 2022

CURRENT SITUATION

Friday, February 4, 2022 – Precipitation associated with the winter storm has passed. The main threats remaining are freezing temperatures and icy road conditions. The National Weather Service anticipates Friday night to bring the coldest temperatures of the week. Temperatures will gradually continue to rise through mid-week, with anticipated highs in the 40's.

The North Texas Transit Authority will continue to monitor and maintain roadways in 12-hour shifts until noon on Sunday.

The City of Denton will be closing their emergency shelter at the MLK Jr. Center at noon on Sunday.

Should you need to travel, keep the following winter driving tips in mind:

- Reduce speed and allow plenty of space between you and other vehicles.
- Avoid sharp turns and breaking suddenly.
- Stop and accelerate slowly and in second gear for better traction.
- If your vehicle begins to skid, turn your steering wheel in the opposite direction. Avoid breaking and sharp turns.
- Sand, cardboard and kitty litter can reestablish traction if you become stuck.
- Keep blankets, water, jumper cables, flashlights and a tow rope in your vehicle in the event you become stranded.
