



STREET MAINTENANCE SALES AND USE TAX FACT SHEET

WHAT CAN THE STREET MAINTENANCE SALES TAX BE USED FOR?

Funds may be used only to maintain and repair municipal streets and sidewalks that existed on the date of the election to adopt the tax. It may not be used to build new streets.

[Refer to Tax Code, Sect. 327.008.]

WHAT ARE “MUNICIPAL” STREETS?

A “municipal street” includes the entire width of a way (including sidewalks) held by a municipality in fee or by easement or dedication that has a part open for public use for vehicular travel. The term does not include a designated state or federal highway or road or a designated county road.

HOW HAS THE CITY USED THE STREET MAINTENANCE SALES TAX.

The Street Maintenance Sales Tax has been used for the purchase of material for repairs and maintenance for streets and sidewalks. Recent projects include the resurfacing or overlay of Shady Shore Rd, Wilson Dr., Prince Drive, and Oak Lakes Street.

When did the City of Lake Dallas implement the Street Maintenance Sales and Use Tax?

A 1/4 cent (\$0.25) Street Maintenance Sales and Use Tax was approved by the voters in November of 2014 and reauthorized by the voters in May of 2018.

Who pays for the Sales Tax?

Anyone doing business in the city. That is, not just residents but visiting shoppers, too.
